2019-2020 PROGRAM PACKET



ABOUT THE PROGRAM:

Each year, the generous community of Jackson Hole offers over 70 scholarships from various organizations, foundations and community groups worth more than \$800,000. These scholarships are offered to students graduating from a Teton County, Wyoming high school:

- Jackson Hole High School
- Summit Innovations School
- Jackson Hole Community School
- The Mountain Academy of Teton Science Schools.

The program is jointly administered by the Fund for Public Education, the Community Foundation of Jackson Hole, and Jackson Hole High School.

ADVICE FOR STUDENTS:

Please take your time completing these applications. Know that the scholarship committees who will consider your application are awarding funds in honor of a specific person or passion and want to know how you will carry that legacy forward. There's a short essay in the main portion of the application to describe your most meaningful achievement, as well as room to provide additional information about yourself. Use both of those spaces wisely. Be sure to note the scholarships that request essays, sample artwork, letters of recommendation or interviews.

All scholarships use the Teton County Scholarship General Application which you will complete online (a copy of this application can be found in the back of this packet so you can see what it looks like). Start with this. Scholarships that ask for additional materials will require submission through an additional online form. Directions can be found on the following pages, but please feel free to ask your guidance counselor for more information. Students or families who need additional help completing applications should contact Mary Tisi at Jackson Hole High School (mtisi@tcsd.org).

DEADLINE

Both the General Application and all supplemental materials required by individual scholarships must be submitted by:

4:00 pm Monday, February 17, 2020

HOW TO APPLY:

Please give yourself plenty of time to complete the process. If you have any questions, stop by your school's counseling office or email your school counselor.

1. SELECT THE SCHOLARSHIP OPPORTUNITIES THAT BEST FIT YOU. Most scholarships are listed in alphabetical order. We encourage you to read through them all and consider the ones that best match your strengths, experience, and goals. Remember that every scholarship requires the General Application, as well as the additional requirements listed below. There is no limit to the number of awards for which you may apply.

2. GATHER YOUR MATERIALS. Start by reviewing a blank copy the General Application and the additional criteria for each scholarship (all found in the packet). Make sure you have all the required information before you begin the application process. At minimum, you will need:

- **TRANSCRIPT.** All scholarships require a copy of your transcript to be uploaded with your General Application. If you are a JHHS student, you will be emailed a copy of your transcript after semester 1 grades are posted.
- **REFERENCES.** References and letters of recommendation should come from people who know you well, including teachers, coaches, or employers. Be sure to give them plenty of notice, so that they have time to complete the letter ahead of the scholarship deadline. As with supplemental materials, references will receive a link for uploading letters once you have submitted your General Application.
- **RESUME.** Your resume should be and clear and concise record of your experience. Include employment history, volunteer experiences, awards you have received, and leadership positions that you have held.
- **TEST SCORES.** You will need your ACT and SAT test scores. If you have taken either test more than once, you will be asked to provide your highest scores.
- **PARENT/GUARDIAN PERMISSION.** Your parent or guardian will need to sign your form and provide their contact information.
- **SUPPLEMENTAL MATERIALS.** Many scholarships will require additional essays or other supplemental materials. This information is clearly noted in the scholarship packet. After you have submitted your General Application, you will receive an emailed link to upload the supplemental materials required for each scholarship you have chosen.

3. SUBMIT YOUR APPLICATION: To begin the General Application, visit FundForPublicEducation.org/Scholarships-Apply-Now and click on APPLY NOW. You will be asked to create a Submittable account, which is quick, easy, and free. If you already have a Submittable account, please login. Once in Submittable, you will be asked to fill out the General Application and click SUBMIT. The system will send you an email acknowledging the receipt of your General Application. You will then receive a second email a day or two later with the links for uploading any supplemental materials that are required. You may be asked to upload the same document more than once.

THE SCHOLARSHIPS:

ALLAN D. OWENS MEMORIAL SCHOLARSHIP

Given by Owens Orthodontics and open to all graduating seniors. Priority will be given to students who have demonstrated leadership in school and/or community. Participation in activities and financial need will also be considered.

ADDITIONAL REQUIREMENTS: Submit a brief essay describing how you envision your life ten years from now and how your high school education has prepared you to meet the challenges of the next ten years.

VALUE: \$1,000

ALPINE WINTER JUBILEE SCHOLARSHIP

Supported by generous donors within the Alpine community, this scholarship will be granted to a student living in Alpine, Wyoming, who has demonstrated exceptional community leadership.

ADDITIONAL REQUIREMENTS: Must reside in or between Alpine and Etna and complete an essay describing what community means to you and how you demonstrate leadership in the Alpine Community.

VALUE: \$500

ALVIS FORBES STUDENT ATHLETE MEMORIAL SCHOLARSHIP

Open to any graduating senior who has lettered in a high school sport or, by coach recommendation, has excelled in non-school affiliated athletics (i.e., dancing, hockey, or figure skating) and maintained at least a 3.00 GPA.

ADDITIONAL REQUIREMENTS: An essay answering the following question: "How have the lessons you have learned as an athlete shaped your character and code of ethics, and how will those lessons impact your future goals and ability to reach them?"

VALUE: \$500

AMERICAN LEGION POST OF JACKSON HOLE SCHOLARSHIP

The American Legion Post 43 offers a one-time scholarship to graduating seniors who will be attending any college or technical school. Winners are chosen based on the following criteria:

- 30% Participation in activities that involve patriotism and support of country and flag
- 25% Financial need
- 15% Extracurricular and volunteer activities in high school
- 15% Leadership experience
- 15% Academic record

ADDITIONAL REQUIREMENTS: A short essay of 300 words or less on the topic “What Patriotism Means to Me.” Letters of recommendation from American Legion members not related to the applicant are also encouraged and applicants are encouraged to mention the name of any family members who are serving or have served in the Armed Forces of the U.S.

VALUE: \$500-\$1,000

ARCHIE AND LOIS (KEMPER) JURICH SCHOLARSHIP

The Archie and Lois (Kemper) Jurich Scholarships are awarded to students with family lineage in Teton County, Wyoming dating to 1950 or earlier, with preference given to students with financial need.

ADDITIONAL REQUIREMENT: Applicants must submit a brief essay that describes their family’s history in Teton County, Wyoming.

VALUE: Up to \$10,000. Scholarship amount and duration may vary. Multiple scholarships may be awarded.

BANK OF JACKSON HOLE ART SCHOLARSHIP

Bank of Jackson Hole offers scholarships to graduating seniors in honor of local painter Conrad Schwiering and his wife, Mary Ethel, a dedicated educator. While applicants do not have to major in art or an art-related field, they must show an interest or talent in the fine arts of drawing and/or painting. Applicant must have a GPA of 2.0 or higher.

ADDITIONAL REQUIREMENTS: The applicant must submit three original pieces of artwork to James Ryan, President of Bank of Jackson Hole, no later than 4pm on Monday, February 17th, 2020. Mr. Ryan can be found at the Main Branch of Bank of Jackson Hole, 990 W. Broadway in Jackson. Please include your full name, mailing address, and telephone number on the back of each piece. In addition to the artwork, applicants must submit an essay on their goals for the future and how art may be a part of that, either as a hobby or as a profession.

VALUE: \$2500 (1st place), \$1500 (2nd place), \$1000 (3rd place)

BILL HOLDA MEMORIAL SCHOLARSHIP

Awarded to a graduating senior who resides in the northern part of Teton County (Moran, Kelly, Moose, Buffalo Valley, etc.). Special consideration will be given to the children/grandchildren of Grand Teton National Park families and/or families of Jackson Hole Fire/EMS members. Other Teton County resident applicants planning to specialize in emergency services or resource land management careers will also be considered.

ADDITIONAL REQUIREMENTS: An essay of 300 words or less describing your educational/career goals, as well as how this scholarship will help you achieve those goals. Applicants will also be required to submit two letters of recommendation (one from a teacher, one from an administrator or school counselor, and one from a person not affiliated with the school, such as an employer).

VALUE: \$1,000

THE BILLY FRANK MEMORIAL SCHOLARSHIP

The Billy Frank Memorial Scholarship has been established by the Frank family to honor the memory of Billy Frank. One or two scholarships are awarded annually to students who have demonstrated a high level of academic achievement and leadership. The scholarships are intended to support students who specifically would like to attend an out-of-state college or university. Scholastic ability, future goals, and a personal essay are the main criteria used to select recipients.

ADDITIONAL REQUIREMENTS: Applicants will be asked to provide an essay (500 words or less) that addresses the following questions: As his personal credo, Billy Frank said, "I sincerely hope humans are able to unify the societies of the world into a single dynamic in order to sustain the Earth." What do you think that unified dynamic would look like? How can you contribute to a healthy and sustainable world? How do your future goals help support a just and fair society?

VALUE: Up to (2) \$1,125 one-time payments, or (1) \$2,250 one-time payment. Acceptance to an out-of-state school required.

BUFFALO VALLEY AWARD

This award is made possible by anonymous donors and given to students who reside in Buffalo Valley (83013 zip code). Applicants must be well-rounded, planning to attend a two or four year college, demonstrate financial need and show a history of public service, community spirit and capable academic performance.

VALUE: \$1,500

CHARLES REID SCHOUBOE MEMORIAL SCHOLARSHIP

The Charles Reid Schouboe Memorial Scholarship recognizes students who embody the spirit, character and leadership qualities of Reid Schouboe. The recipient of this scholarship must be a graduating senior from either Teton or Sublette County, Wyoming. Leadership potential, career goals, and personal statements are the main criteria used to select recipients. Special consideration will be given to students who share some of Reid's interests including his love of snowmobiling, snowboarding, dirt

biking, roping, rodeo, cowboying, and hunting, as well as a general love for our unique community.

ADDITIONAL REQUIREMENTS: Please include a brief (approximately 600 words) essay describing yourself, your interests, your goals for college and for your future, and why this scholarship is important to you. Applicants must also submit two letters of recommendation.

VALUE: One scholarship over four years, amount varies.

THE CHRIS HODGES MEMORIAL “LIVIN’ THE DREAM” SCHOLARSHIP

This scholarship is available to any graduating senior and is presented in memory of Chris Hodges.

ADDITIONAL REQUIREMENTS: Please upload an essay addressing the following points: Why are you the most deserving of this monetary award? What are your future plans in terms of college, sports, or career? If chosen how would you pay this award forward and how would you live your life to the best?

VALUE: \$1,500

THE CLUB AT 3 CREEK SCHOLARSHIP

The 3 Creek Ranch Scholarship awards scholarships to students who have demonstrated community involvement, a minimum GPA of 3.0, and financial need.

ADDITIONAL REQUIREMENTS: Please submit a brief (250-300 words) essay describing the greatest challenge you've experienced and how you overcame it. Applicants will also be asked to submit two letters of recommendation.

VALUE: Up to \$5,000 one-time payment. Multiple scholarships may be awarded.

THE CLUB AT 3 CREEK EMPLOYEE SCHOLARSHIP

This scholarship is designed to advance the academic success of local students who have been closely involved with 3 Creek Ranch Golf Club. Eligible applicants must be in the current graduating class of a Teton County high school; reside in Teton County or Lincoln County, Wyoming, or Teton County, Idaho; possess a minimum 2.75 cumulative grade point average; and have worked at least one summer at 3 Creek Ranch for a minimum of 250 hours or be a child of a full-time employee at 3 Creek Ranch.

ADDITIONAL REQUIREMENTS: Applicants will be asked to submit a brief (250-300 words) essay describing the what they think will be their biggest challenge as they continue their education, and how they will address it. Applicants will also be asked to submit two letters of recommendation and documentation of their employment at 3 Creek. Work history will be considered when making awards.

VALUE: up to \$20,000 over four years. Multiple scholarships may be awarded.

CRIMESTOPPERS SCHOLARSHIP

This scholarship goes to a graduating senior who is planning to enter a career in the criminal justice field (including, though not limited to, a career as a police officer, deputy, crime scene technician, forensics technician, federal agent, or the Department of Homeland Security.)

ADDITIONAL REQUIREMENTS: A short essay describing your career goals and how the scholarship would help you reach those goals.

VALUE: \$2,000 (\$1,000 per year for two years during which student will stay in contact with Crimestoppers who will offer mentorship toward a career in law enforcement).

DAVEY JACKSON CHAPTER OF THE DAUGHTERS OF THE AMERICAN REVOLUTION SCHOLARSHIPS

The Daughters of the American Revolution, founded in 1890 and headquartered in Washington, DC, is a non-profit, non-political, volunteer women's lineage organization dedicated to promoting patriotism, preserving American history, and securing America's future through better education for children. The Davey Jackson Chapter is offering one or more scholarships to college bound high school seniors.

ADDITIONAL REQUIREMENTS: Please provide a 350-400 word essay describing how the U.S. Constitution has affected you personally. This award is based solely upon the quality of the essay. To be considered, the essay must follow these guidelines:

- Include a title page with the title of the essay, the student's name, and the exact number of words in the essay
- The essay should be between 350-400 words
- The essay must be typed, double-spaced, using an easily legible 11 or 12 point font
- The essay should demonstrate a personal knowledge of the Constitution and knowledge of two or more Constitutional Amendments, as well as the Bill of Rights
- Please do not include your name in the body of the essay

Our Constitution Rocks, by Juliette Turner is a great reference. Another good resource is The U.S. Constitution available at www.constitutionfacts.com. Winners will receive their scholarship award in the form of a check which may be used toward college expenses.

VALUE: Varies, however prior scholarships have been awarded between \$250 and \$4000.

DELTA KAPPA GAMMA SCHOLARSHIP

Intended for a student planning to study education and intending to pursue a career as a teacher.

VALUE: \$500

DUNLAP CONSTRUCTION SCHOLARSHIP

This scholarship is available to any graduating senior with a GPA of 2.5 or higher, who plans to pursue an education and career in a construction-related field. This award is available for qualified trade schools, vocational schools, and those pursuing a degree in construction management at the University of Wyoming. Preference will be given to students who have worked in a construction related job and students who select an in-state school for college or training.

ADDITIONAL REQUIREMENTS: Applicants must submit two letters of recommendation, a financial need form, a current photo of themselves, and a brief (500 words or less) essay describing why they are interested in a construction-related career.

VALUE: \$1,500 for the first year of college or training and the possibility of \$1,500/year for up to four years if a 3.0 or higher GPA is maintained throughout college or the training program.

EAA YOUNG EAGLES FLIGHT SCHOLARSHIP

The EAA Young Eagles Flight Scholarship was created by a group of individuals involved with the Experimental Aircraft Association who wanted to give students living in Teton County, WY the opportunity to learn how to fly. This scholarship provides up to \$8,500 towards the cost of a Private Pilot certificate-including instruction, flight time and books. Recipients will incur some fees as the total cost of completing a license is approximately \$10,000. Applicants must be at least 17 years of age by June 1st of the year in which they apply. Students must demonstrate good academic standing, community service/involvement, financial need and a commitment to becoming a pilot. Participants will need to be available June through the end of August, 4-5 days a week for training. Training will take place at Teton Aviation Center in Driggs, Idaho.

ADDITIONAL REQUIREMENTS: Applicants must submit a personal essay discussing why you want to learn to fly and become a pilot, and what inspired you; what your education and career plans are; and how this scholarship will help you achieve those goals. The essay should also address whether you see aviation being a part of your life in years to come, and whether you have ever participated in a Young Eagles Day flight or been flying in a small plane, and if so how this has played into your desire to become a pilot. Also use this essay to let us know if there is anything else we should know about you or your situation that may shed light on who you are beyond test scores and grades.

VALUE: This scholarship covers up to \$8,500 towards the completion of a Private Pilot Certificate.

ELKS LODGE FRED HOUCHENS JR. SCHOLARSHIP

Given to a high school senior who is a U.S. citizen. This scholarship is based upon scholarship, extracurricular activities, honors/awards and leadership, employment/resourcefulness and financial need.

VALUE: \$500 per year for four years

ELKS LODGE FRED HOUCHENS SR. SCHOLARSHIP

Given to a high school senior who is a U.S. citizen. This scholarship is based upon scholarship, extracurricular activities, honors/awards and leadership, employment/resourcefulness and financial need.

VALUE: \$500 per year for four years

ELKS LODGE JIM TAYLOR MEMORIAL SCHOLARSHIP

This scholarship is based upon scholarship, extracurricular activities, honors/awards and leadership, employment/resourcefulness and financial need.

VALUE: \$500

ELKS LODGE #1713 SCHOLARSHIP

This scholarship is awarded to the relative of an Elk.

VALUE: \$1,000

ERIN'S FUND

This memorial award is given in memory of JHHS graduate, Erin Goodman. This scholarship is awarded to a graduating senior based upon nomination from a teacher or counselor. Preference is given to students who show motivation, always work to the best of their abilities, and demonstrate achievement or improvement during high school, especially in the face of adversity. Financial need and lack of a clear support system may also be considered.

Motivated individual, working to the best of his/her ability.

VALUE: Up to \$4,000

FUZZY BUDDY ANIMAL WELFARE SCHOLARSHIP

This scholarship will be awarded to a Teton County student planning to pursue a career benefiting companion animals. Education can be obtained at a traditional college, vocational/technical school or recognized certification program offering coursework leading to a career as a veterinary technician, veterinarian, animal control officer, animal shelter employee, dog trainer or animal behaviorist.

ADDITIONAL REQUIREMENTS: An essay, not to exceed one page, describing your experience with animals, the educational path you intend to follow, and the reasons why you are choosing to pursue a career in animal care. One letter of recommendation is also required, preferably from an animal care professional.

VALUE: \$1,000

GEOLOGISTS OF JACKSON HOLE EARTH SCIENCE SCHOLARSHIP

This scholarship is awarded to one or more students with a passion for Earth Sciences and who intend to pursue this interest at a four-year college or university. Applicants should intend to study a branch of Earth Science. Scholastic ability, curiosity, career goals and personal statements are the main criteria used to select recipients. The scholarship must be used in the academic year immediately following high school graduation.

ADDITIONAL REQUIREMENTS: Applicants must provide a brief (one page) essay describing how they became interested in Earth Science, what they have done to pursue their interest in this field, and their goals for college.

VALUE: \$2,000 for the first year of college, plus a complimentary one-year Individual Membership in Geologists of Jackson Hole. Up to four winners may be selected and will receive \$2,000 each. Recipients may also apply directly to Geologists of Jackson Hole for additional financial aid beyond the first year of college.

GIRLS ACTIVELY PARTICIPATING (GAP!) SCHOLARSHIP

Wishing to honor the girls who participated in the GAP! program during their middle school years, the criteria for this one time award goes to any girl who was a GAP! member for three years and will enter a two or four year college.

For girls that participated in GAP! for 1-2 years, one additional award will go to someone planning on entering a career in a leadership role, and submits an essay that outlines current female leadership statistics in the chosen field, perceived challenges, and inspirations for the passion and purpose of entering this field.

ADDITIONAL REQUIREMENTS: Write a summary describing how you believe GAP! influenced, helped, and/or supported you throughout your three years of middle school. Feel free to include any specific examples or anecdotes. Recommended to add into paragraph: Would you recommend Girls Actively Participating! to 6th, 7th, or 8th grade girls? Why or why not? In hindsight, how do you feel the GAP! program could be improved?

VALUE: \$300

GRAND TETON LODGE COMPANY CONSERVATION SCHOLARSHIP

This scholarship is awarded to students who reside in the northern end of the valley, specifically Moran, or within Grand Teton National park, and who are pursuing a degree in Environmental Studies, Natural Sciences or Resource Management. Applicants must have a cumulative GPA of 2.5 or higher. Preference is given to applicants with financial need.

ADDITIONAL REQUIREMENT: Applicants should provide a short essay addressing how public lands have had an impact on their life.

VALUE: Up to \$2,000

GRAND TETON LODGE COMPANY CHEF ROBERT WALTON MEMORIAL SCHOLARSHIP

This scholarship has been established by Grand Teton Lodge Company to honor the memory of Executive Chef Robert Walton. Applicants should plan to pursue a degree in Culinary Arts or Food Services Management and must have a cumulative GPA of 2.5 or higher. Preference is given to applicants with financial need.

VALUE: Up to \$2,000

GRAND TETON LODGE COMPANY HOSPITALITY SCHOLARSHIP

The Grand Teton Lodge Company is offering this scholarship opportunity to a graduating senior who plans to pursue a degree in Outdoor Recreation or Tourism Management at the University of Wyoming. Applicants should also have a cumulative GPA of 2.5 or higher. Preference is given to applicants with financial need.

VALUE: Up to \$2,000

HAWTIN JORGENSEN ARCHITECTS SCHOLARSHIP

The architectural firm of Bruce Hawtin and Arne Jorgensen is offering a scholarship to a senior enrolling in any 2 or 4-year college or accredited trade or vocational school. Selection will be based on financial need, scholarship record, and high school activities.

VALUE: \$1,000

JACKSON BREAKFAST ROTARY CLUB SCHOLARSHIP

The Breakfast Rotary Club of Jackson Hole is offering scholarships to be used at a college or trade school of the student's choice. Criteria for selection are: financial need, intended educational pursuit, academic achievement, written essay, community service, high ethical standards, and extracurricular activities.

ADDITIONAL REQUIREMENTS: Applicants should submit an essay of 1,000 words or less that describes their intended educational pursuits and how they will apply their education to life and career.

VALUE: Up to \$4,000 for four years

JACKSON BREAKFAST ROTARY CLUB SCHOLARSHIP: TRADE OR VOCATIONAL SCHOOL

This scholarship will be awarded to a student attending a trade school or vocational training program of up to two years in duration that will lead to employment in a field of interest to the student.

ADDITIONAL REQUIREMENTS: Applicants should submit an essay of 1,000 words or less that describes their intended educational pursuits and how they will apply their education to life and career.

VALUE: \$2000 to \$5000 to be awarded in equal installments over the length of the program.

JACKSON COUNCIL OF CATHOLIC WOMEN SCHOLARSHIP

The Jackson Council of Catholic Women awards a scholarship to a young woman who is a member of Our Lady of the Mountains Parish and who has received the Sacrament of Confirmation. This student must be planning to attend a two or four-year college, a technical school, or a religious community during the next school year.

ADDITIONAL REQUIREMENTS: A two page personal statement including, but not limited to: Something you'd like others to know about you; someone who has influenced your life; and what your Catholic faith means to you.

VALUE: TBD

JACKSON DISTRICT BOY SCOUT SCHOLARSHIP

Awarded to senior students who are currently registered and involved as a Scout in the Jackson District of Boy Scouts of America, and in good standing with a GPA above 2.5.

ADDITIONAL REQUIREMENTS: Applicants must provide the number of years in Boy Scouts, present rank, and troop/unit number; a list of Scout activities, projects, camps, etc.; and a letter from their Scoutmaster or Venturing Leader.

VALUE: Varies, typically \$1,000 per student

JACKSON FIREFIGHTERS ASSOCIATION SCHOLARSHIP

The Jackson Firefighters Association offers a scholarship to a graduating senior or seniors who need assistance in furthering his or her post-high school education. Applicants must have a 2.0 GPA. The award will be based on financial need, scholastic record and personal qualities. Special consideration will be given to the children/grandchildren of present or past members of the Jackson Firefighters Association.

ADDITIONAL REQUIREMENTS: Two letters of recommendation (one from a teacher, one from an administrator, and one from a person not affiliated with the school, such as an employer). Applicants must also submit a brief (100-300 words) essay describing your educational/career goals as well as how this scholarship will help you achieve those goals.

VALUE: Varies

JACKSON HOLE COMMUNITY BAND SCHOLARSHIP

The Jackson Hole Community Band, a volunteer organization playing concert band music for recreation and community service, annually offers up to two cash scholarships (\$250 each) to a graduating high school senior (one for Star Valley and one for Jackson Hole) who regularly attends our community band rehearsals and performances (please contact Dean Scofield or Julie Wilson for more details). The student must attend a majority of rehearsals and performances. In addition they must help serve the band's mission of promoting traditional concert band repertoire to be eligible.

VALUE: \$250

JACKSON HOLE PERFORMING ARTS SCHOLARSHIP

This scholarship is awarded to a student or students pursuing an education in the performing arts (instrumental music, vocal performances, drama or dance). Scholarship recipients will be selected through an audition process.

ADDITIONAL REQUIREMENTS: Applicants must submit a list of three teachers with whom they have studied, a list of music camps or workshops they have attended, and must attend a mandatory audition.

VALUE: Up to \$4,000 over four years

JACKSON HOLE JEWISH COMMUNITY “TIKKUN OLAM” SCHOLARSHIP

Jewish values are rooted in the idea of Tikkun Olam - “healing the world” - through our direct actions. The Tikkun Olam scholarship celebrates a Jackson Hole senior who has demonstrated leadership in a project or projects focused on good deeds in our community or beyond. By committing time and energy into works of healing, the Tikkun Olam scholarship strives to support any student in bringing their dedication to service and good works out into the world. Student must have a GPA of 3.0 or higher, demonstrate leadership of local community service projects focused on making the Jackson Hole community better, and articulate an interest and commitment to continued works of community service after graduation. Students who have similarly focused their time and energy in service works outside of Jackson Hole should also apply. Open to all persons of any or no religious affiliation.

ADDITIONAL REQUIREMENTS: Please write a short statement (150-250 words) on all the ways you have exemplified “Tikkun Olam” or “healing the world”. Please refer to the Wikipedia definition of Tikkun Olam. https://en.wikipedia.org/wiki/Tikkun_olam.

VALUE: \$1,000

JACKSON HOLE LIONS CLUB SCHOLARSHIP

This scholarship will be awarded to students who have a GPA of 3.0 and who are pursuing either a traditional college education or vocational/technical training. Scholarship awards will be based on financial need, academic performance, community service, awards/honors, school activities, and letters of recommendation.

ADDITIONAL REQUIREMENTS: Write an essay of 100 to 500 words discussing why lifelong community volunteerism is important to the fabric of American life. Include examples of your volunteer activities to date. Plus, one letter of recommendation.

VALUE: \$1000/year for four years with proof of a maintained 3.0 GPA

JACKSON HOLE MOUNTAIN RESORT SCHOLARSHIP

The Jackson Hole Mountain Resort is offering scholarships to graduating seniors planning to attend any college or university. First preference will be given to children of Jackson Hole Mountain Resort employees and/or students who have been employed by Jackson Hole Mountain Resort in the past year. Awards are based on the applicant's commitment and tenure at the resort. Secondary preference will be given to members of the high school Alpine or Nordic teams, or Jackson Hole Ski/Snowboard Club.

VALUE: \$1,000

JACKSON HOLE SKI PATROL MEMORIAL SCHOLARSHIP

This scholarship honors the spirit of ski patrollers no longer with us by recognizing students who embrace the same spirit and passion for skiing and outdoor adventure. The recipient will be a student who is a skier or snowboarder with an understanding of the dynamic nature of recreating and/or working outdoors safely, and has the desire to help others do the same through knowledge, teamwork and creative problem solving.

ADDITIONAL REQUIREMENTS: Applicants should submit a one-page narrative about a challenging situation or problem that you had to overcome. Describe how you tackled the challenge and what you learned from the experience about one or more of the following: your personal strengths, leadership, group dynamics, decision making, problem solving and/or teamwork.

VALUE: \$2,000

JACKSON PFLAG (PARENTS, FAMILIES, AND FRIENDS OF LESBIANS AND GAYS) SCHOLARSHIP

Jackson PFLAG is part of the national PFLAG organization, uniting people who are lesbian, gay, bisexual, transgender, and queer (LGBTQ) with families, friends, and allies. This scholarship is offered to at least one student who advances the cause of social and/or economic justice in our community. Although PFLAG has a focus on the LGBTQ communities, we encourage applications based on other social and economic justice work, be that with communities of color, disability, economic status or with other groups who are marginalized in our community.

ADDITIONAL REQUIREMENTS: Applicants should submit an essay describing how they have helped to advance the cause of social justice in their community. It should clearly identify direct actions the applicant has taken to make Teton County a more affirming community and should expand on how they have changed as an individual.

VALUE: The value of this scholarship varies based on the strength of the application pool. More than one scholarship may be awarded. We have experienced years where we have received multiple applications but have had no student accurately answer the requirements of the essay question, resulting in no scholarship being awarded.

JAMES W. EDWARDS MEMORIAL SCHOLARSHIP

Given by Owens Family Dentistry and open to all graduating seniors. Priority will be given to students who have demonstrated leadership in school and/or community. Participation in activities and financial need will also be considered.

ADDITIONAL REQUIREMENTS: Submit a brief essay describing how you envision your life ten years from now and how your high school education has prepared you to meet the challenges of the next ten years.

VALUE: \$1,000

JOHN BERNADYN MEMORIAL SKI PATROLMAN SCHOLARSHIP

John Bernadyn was an electrical engineer for Bendix Corporation who was instrumental in designing the first lunar module. At age 40 he pursued a Ski Patrol career and had a key role in configuring the circuitry of the first tram at Teton Village. He was a single, religious man and a mentor to many during his 33 years on the Ski Patrol. Applicants must have a cumulative GPA of 2.5 or higher, and priority will be shown to an active student with interests in snow sports as well as sons and daughters of Jackson Hole Mountain Resort employees.

ADDITIONAL REQUIREMENTS: Applicants should submit a one-page essay describing their plans and goals for college and career, and how this scholarship will help.

VALUE: \$2,000

JOINT EFFORT PHYSICAL THERAPY SCHOLARSHIP

Open to all students on plan on a career in healthcare. This may include physicians, nursing, CNAs, athletic training, massage therapy, physical therapy (PTs or PTAs), occupational therapy, speech therapy, psychology, or social work.

ADDITIONAL REQUIREMENTS: Applicants must submit a brief essay (1000 words or less), explaining how they intend to impact the health care field, and what changes or improvements they would like to see made in the field.

VALUE: \$1,000 for the first year of college. Maybe be extended to \$1,000/year for up to four years.

JUNIOR ADVOCATE SCHOLARSHIP

Community Safety Network supports lasting change in the lives of those affected by domestic violence, sexual assault or stalking. We are pleased to offer a scholarship to a student or students who show an understanding of and interest in preventing relationship violence, improving the awareness of healthy vs. unhealthy relationships and has plans for the future that incorporate this knowledge. Applicants must have completed the Community Safety Network's Junior Advocate training and contributed to violence prevention, or demonstrated a commitment to a related field of study (criminal justice, women's studies, social justice, mental health); or provided peer leadership in preventing and promoting healthy relationships.

ADDITIONAL REQUIREMENTS: Applicants must submit a brief essay describing what lesson they think is most important to teach peers about healthy relations and why?

VALUE: \$1,000

KARL M. JOHNSON FOUNDATION SCHOLARSHIP

This scholarship is awarded on the basis of community service and leadership.

ADDITIONAL REQUIREMENTS: Applicants must submit a one page essay on why community service is important, as well as specific examples of how they have shown community service and leadership.

VALUE: \$2,000

KATIE TAPP MEMORIAL SCHOLARSHIP

The Katie Tapp Memorial Scholarship Fund annually awards a scholarship to a student entering the fields of mathematics, science, and/or engineering. Scholastic ability, academic potential, career goals, and a personal statement are the main criteria used to select recipients. Financial need will also be considered. The scholarship must be used in the academic year immediately following high school graduation.

ADDITIONAL REQUIREMENTS: Applicants must provide a list any awards or honors they have received, two letters of reference (at least one from a faculty advisor or instructor), and a **HAND WRITTEN** essay of approximately 500 words describing them, their special interests, their educational and career goals, and why they have chosen these goals.

VALUE: \$8,000 over four years

KIWANIS /KEY CLUB of JACKSON HOLE SCHOLARSHIP – JIM KAYE MEMORIAL SCHOLARSHIP

Awarded to a current member of the Key Club at Jackson Hole High School.

VALUE: \$750 per year for two years

LEADER IN CONSERVATION SCHOLARSHIP

The Cougar Fund will recognize an applicant with a passion for wildlife conservation and a history of volunteering for local conservation initiatives. Special consideration will be given to higher GPAs (3.0 or better); however, applications showing a consistent level of participation in extracurricular activities that involve conservation may also be considered. Students must plan to pursue a degree in science, education, conservation, or a related field.

ADDITIONAL REQUIREMENTS: Applicants must submit an essay of 500 words or less describing their personal conservation hero. What is it about this person that inspires you? How has their work helped your understanding of conservation issues? How would you like your work in conservation to be regarded by future generations?

VALUE: \$500

LEVI DOWELL MEMORIAL SCHOLARSHIP

This scholarship was established in memory of Levi Dowell and is intended to recognize a student who possesses a spirit and interests similar to Levi's. This nonrenewable award is for freshman year of college only. Criteria for this scholarship include academic merit and financial need. Special consideration will be given to students who share some of Levi's interests including the outdoors, camping, snowboarding, travel, music and the Spanish language.

VALUE: Up to \$500

MARIANA BATSON AUGE MEMORIAL SCHOLARSHIP

The Mariana Batson Auge Memorial Scholarship is awarded to a senior with aspirations of becoming a teacher and planning to major in education.

VALUE: \$1,000

MARTY & RAYLENE SCHOLTENS FAMILY FIRST SCHOLARSHIP

The Scholtens Family First Scholarship supports any student who will be the first in their immediate family (mom, dad, brothers, and sisters) to attend college. There is no minimum GPA for this scholarship. Financial need is considered.

ADDITIONAL REQUIEMENTS: Applicants must submit a brief essay letting the scholarship selectors know why they should pick you, what made you pick the college that you plan to attend, and what this opportunity would mean to you and your family.

VALUE: \$1,000

MAYSIE REACH MEMORIAL SCHOLARSHIP

This memorial award is given by the Jackson Hole Chamber of Commerce in memory of JHHS graduate, Maysie Reach. This scholarship is awarded to students pursuing business administration majors, who have taken part in some extracurricular activities while in high school and who demonstrate financial need. Students must be attending a Wyoming university, college or technical school.

VALUE: Up to \$1,000

MYLES BORSHELL / ART ASSOCIATION ART SCHOLARSHIP

Myles Borshell was an accomplished local artist whose monochromatic paintings have been collected throughout the country. Myles always considered art to be a way of reaching others. His family worked with the Art Association to create a scholarship to honor Myles, his art and his vision. This scholarship is awarded to a graduating senior who has chosen to continue instruction in the visual arts or crafts.

ADDITIONAL REQUIREMENTS: Applicants must submit a list of art classes they plan to take in college with a brief description of each. An interview may be scheduled with each applicant. If so, plan to bring a portfolio of your work to review with Art Association staff.

VALUE: \$1,000

NATIONAL MUSEUM OF WILDLIFE ART - ART LEADERSHIP SCHOLARSHIP IN HONOR OF THE MEMORY OF DICK JENNINGS

The National Museum of Wildlife Art annually offers one scholarship of \$4,000 to a Teton County high school senior whose passion for fine art and design has motivated them to improve their skills and share their talents with others. The student should be planning to continue their study of art and design at the college level.

ADDITIONAL REQUIREMENTS: Applicants must submit five digital images of their original artwork

VALUE: \$4,000

NELSON ENGINEERING SCHOLARSHIP

The consulting firm of Nelson Engineering is pleased to offer a scholarship to a JHHS graduating senior enrolling in a 2 or 4-year accredited college pursuing an undergraduate in engineering. Selection will be based on financial need, academic potential, and career goals including background and interest in mathematics, sciences and engineering. Jackson Hole Chapter #50, Order of Eastern Star, is offering a scholarship that may be used at any institution of higher learning. This scholarship is open to all students, but preference is given to applicants who have an Eastern Star heritage.

ADDITIONAL REQUIREMENTS: Applicants must submit one letter of recommendation, an autobiographical letter indicating their reasons for requesting financial aid, reasons for seeking further education, work experience, and any information that they feel will aid the selection committee

VALUE: Varies

PATRICIA BODA MEMORIAL SCHOLARSHIP

This scholarship, supported by the St. Johns Foundation, is offered in honor of Patricia Boda, who was a passionate advocate for nurses and nursing. TETON COUNTY COMMISSIONERS STATE FUNDED SCHOLARSHIPS

This scholarship is awarded to three seniors graduating from a Teton County, Wyoming high school who each have a GPA of 3.0 or better. This scholarship may be used at the University of Wyoming or any one of the community colleges in Wyoming. This is a state funded program.

VALUE: Teton County Commissioner Scholarships offer \$500 per semester for the first year (\$1,000 in first year). The County Commissioners will then choose one qualifying

student to continue in the program for another six consecutive semesters (excluding summer), if a cumulative GPA of 2.5 or above is maintained (+\$3,000).

TETON COUNTY EDUCATION ASSOCIATION SCHOLARSHIP

Awarded to a student who is planning a career in public service, this scholarship may be used at a school of the student's choice. Preference will be given to: children of Wyoming Education Association members, children of educators, and children of Teton County School District employees.

VALUE: \$500

TETON COUNTY FAIR BOARD SCHOLARSHIP

This scholarship is awarded to a Teton County graduate who is planning to attend an accredited school within one year of graduation AND has had a significant influence and participation in the Teton County Fair within the past three years.

ADDITIONAL REQUIREMENTS: Applicants must submit an essay on one of the following subjects:

- Teton County Fair and its role in our community,
- How has the Teton County fair influenced you and your family?
- In the big picture, what role do small town fairs play in America?
- In the future, how do you see yourself bettering your community?

Applicants must also submit two letters of recommendation: one from a teacher and one from a Teton County resident who is not a Teton County Fair Board member or employed by the school district. A personal interview will be required.

VALUE: \$500 per year for two years

TETON COUNTY SOCIAL SERVICES SCHOLARSHIP

The Teton County Social Services Scholarship will be awarded to a graduating high school senior who plans to major in social work, psychology or a related field such as behavioral health, mental health, or substance abuse. Applicants must be able to articulate what area of social services they are interested in and why. Preference will be given to those holding a GPA of 3.0 or higher. Community involvement and job experience will also be considered.

ADDITIONAL REQUIREMENTS: Applicants must submit an essay describing what area of human services appeals to them and why, and how do they plan to use their degree? The essay should also address the experiences or skills the applicant has that would be beneficial to working in a human services field.

VALUE: \$2,500

TETON PINES COUNTRY CLUB SCHOLARSHIP

This scholarship is designed to advance the academic success of local students who have been closely involved with Teton Pines Country Club. Eligible applicants must be in the current graduating class of a Teton County high school; reside in Teton County or Lincoln County, Wyoming or Teton County, Idaho; possess a minimum 2.5 cumulative grade point average; and have worked at least one summer at Teton Pines Country Club or, worked as a caddy for a minimum of 22 rounds in any golf season or be a child of a full-time employee at Teton Pines Country Club.

ADDITIONAL REQUIREMENTS: Applicants must submit an essay that addresses the questions below:

- What accomplishment are you most proud of during your high school years and why?
- What do you feel the biggest challenge will be during your continuing education?
- Please provide documentation of your employment at Teton Pines, including year, job and supervisor, or note parents' name and employment position.

Applicants must also submit two letters of recommendation.

VALUE: up to \$20,000 over four years, multiple scholarships awarded

TETON TRAIL RUNNERS SCHOLARSHIP

This scholarship is intended to encourage and recognize the value in life-long running. This can include the pursuit of competitive running, or can simply recognize an individual who has a passion for recreational running and the positive impacts it has on their lives. This scholarship also recognizes the value of community service in support of the development of healthy communities. Community service does not need to be directly related to running. Recipient must be a graduating senior of Jackson Hole High School planning on attending a 2 or 4-year college or university. Recipient must have a demonstrated interest in running recreationally or competitively in the future.

ADDITIONAL REQUIREMENTS: Applicants must submit a one-page essay that explains their personal passion for running, how they plan to use running in their life and why this will benefit you, and how they have contributed to promoting a healthy community.

VALUE: \$375-\$750

VON GONTARD MEMORIAL SCHOLARSHIP

One scholarship is awarded to a graduating senior with a GPA of 2.5 or better, who will be attending the University of Wyoming. The recipient will be judged on financial need, an essay, and an interview.

ADDITIONAL REQUIREMENTS: Applicants must submit an essay between describing their life goals and how they expect to attain them.

VALUE: \$4,000 per year at the University of Wyoming; renewable for up to four years if a 2.00 GPA is maintained.

WOMEN IN NATURAL RESOURCES AND ENGINEERING SCHOLARSHIPS

Y2 Consultants, an engineering firm in Jackson, is offering scholarships to two young women who plan to major in the field of Engineering and one scholarship to a young woman who plans to enter the field of Natural Resources Management or Environmental Sciences. Applicants must have a cumulative GPA of 3.0 or higher to apply. Strong preference will be shown to applicants with extracurricular activities.
