



TETON COUNTY SCHOLARSHIP PROGRAM 2020-2021 BOOKLET

Welcome to the Teton County Scholarship Program. Before you begin the application process, please take a moment to look through our scholarship booklet to familiarize yourself with the scholarships that are available and to determine which best fit you, your goals, and your needs. There are scholarships to fit every student, and we encourage everyone to apply.

DEADLINE

The TCSP General Application and all supplemental materials required by individual scholarships must be submitted by **5:00 pm on Friday, February 12, 2021.**

HOW TO APPLY:

Please give yourself plenty of time to complete the process. If you have any questions, stop by your school's counseling office or email your school counselor.

As you complete this application process, you'll be asked to upload documents and information. At minimum, you will need:

- **TRANSCRIPT.** All scholarships require a copy of your transcript to be uploaded with your TCSP General Application.
- **RECOMMENDATIONS.** Recommendation should come from people who know you well, including teachers, coaches, guidance counselors or employers. They should not come from family members or friends. Be sure to give those writing your references plenty of notice so they have time to complete the letter ahead of the February 12 scholarship deadline.
- **EXPERIENCES.** You should have a clear and concise record of your experiences, including employment history, volunteerism, awards you

have received, clubs and activities to which you belong, and leadership positions that you have held.

- **TEST SCORES.** You will need your ACT and/or SAT test scores, if you took either test. If you have taken either test more than once, you will be asked to provide your highest scores.
- **FUTURE GOALS:** You will be asked to provide information on your future goals, intended area of study, and which colleges, vocational programs you're considering.
- **FAFSA.** The Free Application for Federal Student Aid is a standardized form that helps determine your financial need. It's free to apply and required by most colleges or schools. You'll need to upload a copy of your FAFSA to be considered for scholarships that are based on financial need. If you are ineligible for the FAFSA, please download the TCSP Financial Need Statement, which is available at fundforpubliceducation.org/scholarships.
- **PARENT/GUARDIAN CONTACT INFO.** Your parent or guardian will need to provide their contact information.
- **SUPPLEMENTAL MATERIALS.** After you have submitted your TCSP General Application, you will be directed to the individual scholarships for which you are eligible. Many of these scholarships will require additional essays or other supplemental materials to be uploaded. Be sure you check the scholarship booklet and have those materials ready.

THE SCHOLARSHIPS:

Below is the name, description, eligibility requirements, and value of each scholarship.

ALLAN D. OWENS MEMORIAL SCHOLARSHIP

The Allan D. Owens Memorial scholarship is sponsored by Owens Orthodontics and is open to all graduating seniors. Priority will be given to students who have demonstrated leadership in school and/or community. Participation in activities and financial need will also be considered.

REQUIREMENT:

- Essay: Describe how you envision your life ten years from now and how your high school education has prepared you to meet the challenges of the next ten years.

VALUE: \$1,000 one-time scholarship

ALPINE COMMUNITY SCHOLARSHIP

Sponsored by the Alpine Winter Jubilee and supported by generous donors within the Alpine community, this scholarship is awarded to a student living in Alpine, Wyoming, who has demonstrated exceptional community leadership.

REQUIREMENTS:

- Residence in Alpine (83128 zip code) or Etna (83120 zip code)
- Essay: Describe what community means to you and how you demonstrate leadership in the Alpine Community.

VALUE: \$500 one-time scholarship

ALVIS FORBES MEMORIAL STUDENT ATHLETE SCHOLARSHIP

The Alvis Forbes Memorial Student Athlete Scholarship celebrates the legacy of Dr. Alvis Forbes, a long-time orthopaedic surgeon and devoted fan of high school athletics. This scholarship is sponsored by Dr. Forbes' family in his memory.

REQUIREMENTS:

- Proof of having lettered in a high school sport or a recommendation from a local coach for community athletics not affiliated with the schools
- Minimum GPA 3.0
- Essay: How have the lessons you have learned as an athlete shaped your character and code of ethics, and how will those lessons impact your future goals and ability to reach them?

VALUE: \$500 one-time scholarship

AMERICAN LEGION POST OF JACKSON HOLE SCHOLARSHIP

The American Legion Post 43 offers a one-time scholarship to graduating seniors who will be attending any college or technical school. Students are encouraged to submit letters of recommendation from American Legion members who are not family members or relatives, and to provide the names of family members who serve or have served in the United States military. Winners are chosen based on the following criteria:

- 30% Participation in activities that involve patriotism and support of country and flag
- 25% Financial need
- 15% Extracurricular and volunteer activities in high school
- 15% Leadership experience
- 15% Academic record

REQUIREMENTS:

- Essay: Describe what patriotism means to you.

VALUE: \$500-\$1,000 one-time scholarship

ARCHIE AND LOIS (KEMPER) FAMILY SCHOLARSHIP

The Archie and Lois (Kemper) Jurich Scholarship is awarded to students with family lineage in Teton County, Wyoming dating to 1950 or earlier, with preference given to students with financial need.

REQUIREMENTS:

- Family lineage in Teton County, Wyoming dating to 1950 or earlier
- Essay: Describe your family history in Teton County, Wyoming.

VALUE: Up to \$10,000 over four years. Scholarship amount and duration may vary. Multiple scholarships may be awarded.

BANK OF JACKSON HOLE ART SCHOLARSHIP

Bank of Jackson Hole sponsors scholarships to graduating seniors in honor of local painter Conrad Schwiering and his wife, Mary Ethel, a dedicated educator.

While applicants do not have to major in art or an art-related field, they must show an interest or talent in the fine arts of drawing and/or painting.

REQUIREMENTS:

- Minimum GPA 2.0
- Submit three original pieces of artwork to James Ryan, President of Bank of Jackson Hole, no later than 4pm on Monday, February 5, 2021. Mr. Ryan can be found at the Main Branch of Bank of Jackson Hole, 990 W. Broadway in Jackson. Please include your full name, mailing address, and telephone number on the back of each piece.
- Essay: What are your goals for the future, and how art may be a part of that, either as a hobby or as a profession?

VALUE: \$2500 (1st place), \$1500 (2nd place), \$1000 (3rd place). All are one-time scholarships.

BILL HOLDA MEMORIAL SCHOLARSHIP

Sponsored by the Moran Volunteer Firefighters Association, this scholarship celebrates students and families who live in the northern part of Teton County, Wyoming. Special consideration is given to the children/grandchildren of Grand Teton National Park families and/or families of Jackson Hole Fire/EMS members. Other Teton County resident applicants planning to specialize in emergency services or resource land management careers will also be considered.

REQUIREMENTS:

- Essay: Describe your educational/career goals, as well as how this scholarship will help you achieve those goals.
- Two letters of recommendation (one from a teacher, school administrator, or school counselor; and one from a person not affiliated with the school, such as an employer)

VALUE: \$1,000 one-time scholarship

THE BILLY FRANK MEMORIAL SCHOLARSHIP

The Billy Frank Memorial Scholarship was established by the Frank family to honor the memory of Billy Frank. Several scholarships are awarded annually to students who have demonstrated a high level of academic achievement and leadership. Scholastic ability, future goals, and a personal essay are the main criteria used to select recipients.

REQUIREMENTS:

- Must attend an out-of-state college or university
- Graduate from a Teton County, Wyoming high school
- Essays:
 - What is your greatest achievement? What has been the biggest challenge of your life, and how have you overcome it?
 - As his personal credo, Billy Frank said, "I sincerely hope humans are able to unify the societies of the world into a single dynamic in order to sustain the Earth." What do you think that unified dynamic would look like? How can you contribute to a healthy and sustainable world? How do your future goals help support a just and fair society?

VALUE: Multiple \$1,500 one-time scholarships

BUFFALO VALLEY AWARD

This award is made possible by anonymous donors and given to students with financial need who reside in Buffalo Valley. Applicants must be well-rounded, planning to attend a two or four year college, and show a history of public service, community spirit and capable academic performance.

REQUIREMENTS:

- Residence in Buffalo Valley (83013 zip code)

VALUE: \$1,500 one-time scholarship

CHARLES REID SCHOUBOE MEMORIAL SCHOLARSHIP

The Charles Reid Schouboe Memorial Scholarship recognizes graduating seniors who embody the spirit, character and leadership qualities of Reid Schouboe. Special consideration will be given to students with financial need who share some of Reid's interests, including his love of snowmobiling, snowboarding, dirt biking, roping, rodeo, cowboying, and hunting, as well as love for our unique community.

REQUIREMENTS:

- Residence in Teton County or Sublette County, Wyoming
- Two letters of recommendation
- Essays:
 - What is your greatest achievement? What has been the biggest challenge of your life, and how have you overcome it?
 - Describe your love of and commitment to your community.

VALUE: Up to \$8,000 over four years

THE CLUB AT 3 CREEK SCHOLARSHIP

The Club at 3 Creek Ranch awards scholarships to students with financial need who have demonstrated academic merit and community involvement.

REQUIREMENTS:

- Minimum GPA 3.0
- Two letters of recommendation
- Essays:
 - What is your greatest achievement? What has been the biggest challenge of your life, and how have you overcome it?

VALUE: Up to \$5,000 one-time award. Multiple scholarships may be awarded.

THE CLUB AT 3 CREEK EMPLOYEE SCHOLARSHIP

This scholarship is designed to advance the academic success of local students who have been closely involved with 3 Creek Ranch. Work history and financial need will be considered when making awards.

REQUIREMENTS:

- Must have worked at least one summer at 3 Creek Ranch for a minimum of 250 hours (documentation required) or be the child of a full-time employee at 3 Creek Ranch
- In the current graduating class of a Teton County high school and reside in Teton County or Lincoln County, Wyoming, or Teton County, Idaho
- Minimum GPA 2.5
- Two letters of recommendation
- Essays:
 - What is your greatest achievement? What has been the biggest challenge of your life, and how have you overcome it?

VALUE: up to \$10,000 one-time scholarship. Multiple scholarships may be awarded. Returning employees may reapply annually.

COUGAR FUND LEADERSHIP IN CONSERVATION SCHOLARSHIP

This scholarship, sponsored by the Cougar Fund recognizes a student with a passion for wildlife conservation and a history of volunteering for local conservation initiatives. Special consideration will be given to higher GPAs (3.0 or better), however applications showing a consistent level of participation in extracurricular activities that involve conservation may also be considered.

REQUIREMENTS:

- Intended major in science, education, conservation, or a related field

- Essay: Describe your personal conservation hero. What is it about this person that inspires you? How has their work helped your understanding of conservation issues? How would you like your work in conservation to be regarded by future generations?

VALUE: \$500 one-time scholarship

CRIMESTOPPERS SCHOLARSHIP

Sponsored by Jackson Hole Crimestoppers, this scholarship goes to a graduating senior who is planning to enter a career in the criminal justice field.

REQUIREMENTS:

- Intended major in criminal justice or a related field (including, though not limited to, a career as a police officer, deputy, crime scene technician, forensics technician, federal agent, or the Department of Homeland Security)
- Essay: Describe your career goals and how the scholarship would help you reach those goals.

VALUE: \$1,000 per year for two years with mentorship from Crimestoppers

DAVEY JACKSON CHAPTER OF THE DAUGHTERS OF THE AMERICAN REVOLUTION SCHOLARSHIPS

The Daughters of the American Revolution, founded in 1890 and headquartered in Washington, DC, is a nonprofit, non-political, volunteer women's lineage organization dedicated to promoting patriotism, preserving American history, and securing America's future through better education for children. The Davey Jackson Chapter is offering one or more scholarships to college bound high school seniors.

REQUIREMENTS:

- Essay: Describe how the U.S. Constitution has affected you personally. This award is based solely upon the quality of the essay. To be considered, the essay must follow these guidelines:
 - Include a title page with the title of the essay, the student's name, and the exact number of words in the essay.
 - The essay should be between 350-400 words.
 - The essay must be typed, double-spaced, using an easily legible 11 or 12 point font.
 - The essay should demonstrate a personal knowledge of the Constitution and knowledge of two or more Constitutional Amendments, as well as the Bill of Rights.

- Please do not include your name in the body of the essay.

Our Constitution Rocks by Juliette Turner is a great reference. Another good resource is The U.S. Constitution, available at constitutionfacts.com.

VALUE: Varies based on the quality of the essay. Past awards have ranged from \$250 to \$5,000 or more.

DELTA KAPPA GAMMA - CHI CHAPTER SCHOLARSHIP

Sponsored by the local chapter of Delta Kappa Gamma, an international organization that promotes the personal and professional growth of women educators and excellence in education, this scholarship is awarded to a student planning to study education or pursue a career as a teacher.

REQUIREMENTS:

- Intended major in education or a related field

VALUE: \$600 one-time award

DUNLAP CONSTRUCTION SCHOLARSHIP

This scholarship, sponsored by Dunlap Construction and the Dunlap family, is available to any graduating senior who pursues an education and career in a construction related field. This award is available for qualified trade schools, vocational schools, and those pursuing a degree in construction management at the University of Wyoming. Preference will be given to students who have worked in a construction-related job.

REQUIREMENTS:

- Minimum GPA 3.0
- Intended major in construction, construction management or a related field
- Two letters of recommendation, one from a teacher and one from an employer (preferably from the construction trade)
- Essays:
 - What is your greatest achievement? What has been the biggest challenge of your life, and how have you overcome it?
 - Where do you see yourself in 5 years? 10 years? What sacrifices are you willing to make to achieve these goals?
 - Describe your interest in a construction career. How have you made it part of your life, and how will you continue to pursue it?

VALUE: \$1,500 one-time award with the potential to extend the award for up to four years if the student maintains a GPA of 3.0 or higher

EAA YOUNG EAGLES FLIGHT SCHOLARSHIPS

Sponsored by the Experimental Aviation Association Teton Chapter 1049, the EAA Young Eagles Scholarship was created by a group of individuals who wanted to give students of Teton County, WY the opportunity to learn how to fly. This scholarship provides up to \$8,500 towards the cost of a Private Pilot Certificate, including instruction, flight time and books. Recipients will incur some fees, as the total cost of obtaining a license is approximately \$10,000. Students must demonstrate good academic standing, community service/involvement and a commitment to becoming a pilot. Financial need is a consideration. Having past participation in aviation-related activities will be looked upon favorably though is not required.

REQUIREMENTS:

- Age 17 by June 1, 2021 and a junior or senior in high school
- Minimum GPA 2.5
- Two letters of recommendation
- Interview with scholarship sponsors
- Available 4-5 days/week June-August 2021 for training
- Essays:
 - What is your greatest achievement? What has been the biggest challenge of your life, and how have you overcome it?
 - What are your educational and life goals, and how will this scholarship help you achieve them?

VALUE: \$8,500. This scholarship covers most of the cost of instruction and materials for a student to obtain his/her private pilot's license. May be awarded to multiple students.

ERIN'S FUND

This award is given in memory of Jackson Hole High School graduate Erin Goodman. It is awarded to a graduating senior based upon nomination from a teacher or counselor. Preference is given to students who show motivation, always work to the best of their abilities, and demonstrate achievement or improvement during high school, especially in the face of adversity. Financial need and lack of a clear support system may also be considered. Motivated individual, working to the best of his/her ability.

REQUIREMENTS:

- Nominated by teacher or counselor
- Minimum GPA 2.5

VALUE: Up to \$5,000 one-time scholarship. Multiple awards may be given.

FUZZY BUDDY ANIMAL WELFARE SCHOLARSHIP

Sponsored by a local animal lover, this scholarship will be awarded to a student with financial need planning to pursue a career benefiting companion animals. Education can be obtained at a traditional college, vocational/technical school or recognized certification program offering coursework leading to a career as a veterinary technician, veterinarian, animal control officer, animal shelter employee, dog trainer or animal behaviorist.

REQUIREMENTS:

- Minimum GPA 3.0
- Intent to pursue a career related to companion animals
- Two letters of recommendation, with one preferably from an animal care professional
- Essays:
 - What are your educational and life goals, and how will this scholarship help you achieve them?
 - Describe your interest in companion animals. How have you made it part of your life, and how will you continue to pursue it?
 - Describe your experience with animals, the educational path you intend to follow, and the reasons why you are choosing to pursue a career in animal care.

VALUE: \$1,000 one-time scholarship

GEOLOGISTS OF JACKSON HOLE EARTH SCIENCE SCHOLARSHIP

This scholarship, sponsored by the Geologists of Jackson Hole, is awarded to one or more students with a passion for earth science who want to pursue this interest at a four year college or university. Scholastic ability, curiosity, career goals, and essays are the main criteria used to select recipients. This scholarship must be used in the academic year immediately following high school graduation.

REQUIREMENTS:

- Intended major in earth science or a related field
- Essay: Describe how you became interested in earth science, what you have done to pursue your interest in this field, and what your goals are for college

VALUE: \$2,000 for the first year of college, plus a complimentary one year individual membership in Geologists of Jackson Hole. Recipients may also apply to Geologists of Jackson Hole for additional financial aid beyond the first year of college.

GIRLS ACTIVELY PARTICIPATING (GAP!) SCHOLARSHIP

This scholarship honors girls who participated in the Girls Actively Participating (GAP!) program during their middle school years. This scholarship does not allow for deferments due to gap years or missions. Financial need is a consideration.

REQUIREMENTS:

- Participation in GAP! for at least one year; preference given to girls who participated for at least three years
- Minimum GPA 2.5
- Essays:
 - What is your greatest achievement? What has been the biggest challenge of your life, and how have you overcome it?
 - Describe how you believe GAP! influenced, helped, and/or supported you throughout your three years of middle school. Some ideas to strengthen your essay include: specific examples or anecdotes that support your story, including a brief discussion of whether you would recommend Girls Actively Participating! to 6th, 7th, or 8th grade girls, and how you feel the GAP! program might be improved.

VALUE: \$300 one-time scholarship

GRAND TETON LODGE COMPANY CONSERVATION SCHOLARSHIP

Sponsored by the Grand Teton Lodge Company, this scholarship is awarded to students who reside within Grand Teton National Park and want to work with the environment and the natural world. Preference is given to applicants with financial need.

REQUIREMENTS:

- Residence in Moran or Buffalo Valley (83013 zip code), Kelly (83011), or Moose (83012)
- Minimum GPA 2.5
- Intended major in Environmental Studies, Natural Sciences, or Resource Management
- Essays:
 - What is your greatest achievement? What has been the biggest challenge of your life, and how have you overcome it?
 - What are your educational and life goals, and how will this scholarship help you achieve them?
 - Describe how you have supported your community, through volunteerism, work experience and/or other activities.
 - Submit a brief essay addressing how public lands have had an impact on your life.

VALUE: Up to \$2,000 one-time scholarship

GRAND TETON LODGE COMPANY CHEF ROBERT WALTON MEMORIAL SCHOLARSHIP

This scholarship has been established by Grand Teton Lodge Company to honor the memory of Executive Chef Robert Walton. Preference is given to applicants with financial need.

REQUIREMENTS:

- Minimum GPA 2.5
- Intended major in culinary arts or food services management
- Essays:
 - What is your greatest achievement? What has been the biggest challenge of your life, and how have you overcome it?
 - What are your educational and life goals, and how will this scholarship help you achieve them?
 - Describe your interest in the culinary arts. How have you made it part of your life, and how will you continue to pursue it?
 - Describe how you have supported your community, through volunteerism, work experience and/or other activities.

VALUE: Up to \$2,000 one-time scholarship

GRAND TETON LODGE COMPANY HOSPITALITY SCHOLARSHIP

The Grand Teton Lodge Company offers this scholarship opportunity to a graduating senior who shows a passion for hospitality and tourism.

REQUIREMENTS:

- Intended major in outdoor recreation, hospitality, or tourism management
- Must attend the University of Wyoming
- Minimum GPA 2.5
- Essays:
 - What is your greatest achievement? What has been the biggest challenge of your life, and how have you overcome it?
 - What are your educational and life goals, and how will this scholarship help you achieve them?
 - Describe your interest in hospitality and tourism. How have you made it part of your life, and how will you continue to pursue it?
 - Describe how you have supported your community, through volunteerism, work experience and/or other activities.

VALUE: Up to \$2,000 one-time scholarship

HAWTIN JORGENSEN ARCHITECTS SCHOLARSHIP

Sponsored by local architects Bruce Hawtin and Arne Jorgensen, this scholarship is awarded to a senior enrolling in any 2 or 4-year college or accredited trade or vocational school. Selection will be based on financial need, scholarship record, and high school activities.

REQUIREMENTS:

- Essays:
 - What is your greatest achievement? What has been the biggest challenge of your life, and how have you overcome it?
 - What are your educational and life goals, and how will this scholarship help you achieve them?

VALUE: \$1,000 one-time scholarship

JACKSON BREAKFAST ROTARY CLUB SCHOLARSHIP

The Breakfast Rotary Club of Jackson Hole provides scholarship opportunities to be used at a college of the student's choice. Criteria for selection are: financial need, intended educational pursuit, academic achievement, written essay, community service, high ethical standards, and extracurricular activities. Applicants may be required to attend an interview.

REQUIREMENTS:

- Minimum GPA 2.0
- Essays:
 - What is your greatest achievement? What has been the biggest challenge of your life, and how have you overcome it?
 - What are your educational and life goals, and how will this scholarship help you achieve them?
 - Describe your interest in your chosen field. How have you made it part of your life, and how will you continue to pursue it?
 - Describe how you have supported your community, through volunteerism, work experience and/or other activities.

VALUE: Varies

JACKSON BREAKFAST ROTARY CLUB TRADE OR VOCATIONAL SCHOOL SCHOLARSHIP

This scholarship will be awarded to a student attending a trade school or vocational training program of up to two years in duration that will lead to employment in a field of interest to the student. Criteria for selection are: financial need, intended educational pursuit, academic achievement, written essay, community service, high ethical standards, extracurricular activities, and financial need. Applicants may be required to attend an interview.

REQUIREMENTS:

- Minimum GPA 2.0
- Essays:
 - What is your greatest achievement? What has been the biggest challenge of your life, and how have you overcome it?
 - What are your educational and life goals, and how will this scholarship help you achieve them?
 - Describe your interest in your chosen field. How have you made it part of your life, and how will you continue to pursue it?
 - Describe how you have supported your community, through volunteerism, work experience and/or other activities.

VALUE: \$2,000 to \$5,000 to be awarded in equal installments over the length of the program

JACKSON DISTRICT BOY SCOUT SCHOLARSHIP

Awarded to senior students who are currently registered and involved with good standing as a scout in the Jackson District of Boy Scouts of America.

REQUIREMENTS:

- Minimum GPA 2.5
- Provide:
 - The number of years you have been in Boy Scouts
 - Your present rank and troop/unit number
 - A list of your scouting activities, projects, camps, etc.
 - A letter of recommendation from your Scoutmaster or Venturing Leader

VALUE: \$500-\$1,000 per student one-time award (awards may vary)

JACKSON FIREFIGHTERS ASSOCIATION SCHOLARSHIP

The Jackson Firefighters Association sponsors this scholarship to a student who needs financial assistance in furthering their post-high school education. This award is based on financial need, scholastic record and personal qualities. Special consideration will be given to the children/grandchildren of present or past members of the Jackson Firefighters Association.

REQUIREMENTS:

- Minimum GPA 2.0
- Two letters of recommendation (one from a teacher or school administrator, and one from a person not affiliated with the school, such as an employer)
- Essays:
 - What is your greatest achievement? What has been the biggest challenge of your life, and how have you overcome it?
 - What are your educational and life goals, and how will this scholarship help you achieve them?

VALUE: Varies

JACKSON HOLE COMMUNITY BAND SCHOLARSHIP

The Jackson Hole Community Band, a volunteer organization playing concert band music for our community, sponsors this scholarship, which is open to seniors from Jackson Hole and Star Valley who further the band's mission of promoting traditional concert band repertoire.

REQUIREMENTS:

- You must attend a majority of the Jackson Hole Community Band's rehearsals and performances. Please contact jhcband.org for more information.

VALUE: \$250 one-time scholarship

JACKSON HOLE PERFORMING ARTS SCHOLARSHIP

This scholarship is awarded to a student pursuing an education in the performing arts (instrumental music, vocal performances, drama or dance). The recipient will be selected through an audition process. Financial need is a consideration.

REQUIREMENTS:

- Audition with scholarship review committee
- List of three teachers with whom you have studied

- List of music camps or workshops you have attended
- Essays:
 - What is your greatest achievement? What has been the biggest challenge of your life, and how have you overcome it?
 - Describe your interest in the performing arts. How have you made them part of your life, and how will you continue to pursue them?

VALUE: Up to \$4,000 over four years

JACKSON HOLE JEWISH COMMUNITY MAIMONIDES TRADE SCHOOL OR APPRENTICE SCHOLARSHIP

Sponsored by the Jackson Hole Jewish Community, this scholarship celebrates the philosophies of Maimonides, a medieval Jewish scholar, astronomer, and physician who is revered today as one of the most influential figures in Jewish philosophy. One of his most famous quotes is, "Give a man a fish and you feed him for a day; teach a man to fish and you feed him for a lifetime." This scholarship does not allow for deferments due to gap years or missions.

REQUIREMENTS:

- Must be used at a trade or vocational school, or in an apprenticeship program
- Essay: Please take a moment to look up Maimonides, select one of his attributed quotes, and then submit a brief essay on why it resonates with you and your desire to be an apprentice or go to trade school.

VALUE: \$1,000 one-time scholarship

JACKSON HOLE JEWISH COMMUNITY "TIKKUN OLAM" SCHOLARSHIP

Sponsored by the Jackson Hole Jewish Community, this scholarship celebrates the idea of Tikkun Olam - "healing the world" - through direct actions. Preference is given to students who have demonstrated leadership and good works in their community, who have shown a commitment to continued works of community service after graduation, and who have financial need. Open to all persons of any or no religious affiliation.

REQUIREMENTS:

- Minimum GPA 3.0
- Two letters of recommendation
- Essays:
 - Submit a brief essay describing how you have lived the principle of Tikkun Olam and exemplified the idea of healing the world. (Please

refer to the Wikipedia definition of Tikkun Olam at https://en.wikipedia.org/wiki/Tikkun_olam.)

- Describe how you have supported your community, through volunteerism, work experience and/or other activities.

VALUE: \$1,000 one time scholarship

JACKSON HOLE LIONS CLUB SCHOLARSHIP

The Jackson Hole Lions Club Scholarship supports students who are pursuing either a traditional college education or vocational/technical training. Awards are based on financial need, academic performance, community service, awards/honors, and school activities.

REQUIREMENTS:

- Minimum GPA 3.0
- Two letters of recommendation
- Essays:
 - What is your greatest achievement? What has been the biggest challenge of your life, and how have you overcome it?
 - Describe how you have supported your community, through volunteerism, work experience and/or other activities.

VALUE: \$1,000 per year for four years (winners are required to maintain a GPA of 3.0 or higher to maintain funding)

JACKSON HOLE MOUNTAIN RESORT SCHOLARSHIP

The Jackson Hole Mountain Resort sponsors scholarships to graduating seniors planning to attend any college or university. First preference will be given to children of Jackson Hole Mountain Resort employees and/or students who have been employed by Jackson Hole Mountain Resort in the past year. Awards are based on the applicant's commitment and tenure at the resort. Secondary preference will be given to members of the high school Alpine or Nordic teams, or Jackson Hole Ski & Snowboard Club.

REQUIREMENTS:

- Essays:
 - What is your greatest achievement? What has been the biggest challenge of your life, and how have you overcome it?
 - What are your educational and life goals, and how will this scholarship help you achieve them?

- Describe how you have supported your community, through volunteerism, work experience and/or other activities.

VALUE: Varies

JACKSON HOLE SKI PATROL MEMORIAL SCHOLARSHIP

Sponsored by the Jackson Hole Ski Patrol, this scholarship honors students who have actively engaged in outdoor sports (skiing, snowboarding, snowshoeing, climbing, river running, backpacking etc), whose life path has been informed by living the mountain life, and who understands the value of teamwork and learning from taking challenges head on.

REQUIREMENTS:

- Minimum GPA 2.0
- Essays:
 - Describe your interest in outdoor sports. How have you made it part of your life, and how will you continue to pursue it?
 - What is your greatest achievement? What has been the biggest challenge of your life, and how have you overcome it? Describe how you tackled the challenge and what it taught you about one or more of the following: your personal strengths, leadership, group dynamics, decision making, problem solving and/or teamwork.

VALUE: \$2,000 one-time scholarship

JACKSON PFLAG (PARENTS, FAMILIES, AND FRIENDS OF LESBIANS AND GAYS) SCHOLARSHIP

Jackson PFLAG is part of the national PFLAG organization, uniting people who are lesbian, gay, bisexual, transgender, and queer (LGBTQ) with families, friends, and allies. This scholarship is offered to at least one student who advances the cause of social and/or economic justice in our community. Although PFLAG has a focus on the LGBTQ communities, they encourage applications based on other social and economic justice work, be that with communities of color, disability, economic status or with other groups who are marginalized in our community.

REQUIREMENTS:

- Essay: Describe how you have helped to advance the cause of social justice in your community. Your essay should include examples of direct actions you have taken to make Teton County a more affirming community and should discuss how these efforts have changed you as an individual.

VALUE: Varies

JAMES W. EDWARDS MEMORIAL SCHOLARSHIP

Given by Owens Family Dentistry and open to all graduating seniors, this scholarship celebrates students who have demonstrated leadership at school or in the community. Participation in activities and financial need will also be considered.

REQUIREMENTS:

- Essay: Describe how you envision your life ten years from now and how your high school education has prepared you to meet the challenges of the next ten years.

VALUE: \$1,000 one-time scholarship

JOHN BERNADYN MEMORIAL SKI PATROLMAN SCHOLARSHIP

Sponsored by the Jackson Hole Ski Patrol, this scholarship honors the legacy of John Bernadyn, an electrical engineer who was instrumental in designing the first lunar module. At age 40 he became a ski patrolman and had a key role in configuring the circuitry of the first tram at Teton Village. A mentor to many during his 33 years on the Ski Patrol, John exemplified the selflessness of the best patrolers. Preference is given to children of Jackson Hole Mountain Resort employees, to students who show an active interest in snow sports, and to students who are pursuing a career in engineering, math, or religious studies.

REQUIREMENTS:

- Minimum GPA 2.5
- Essay: What are your educational and life goals, and how will this scholarship help you achieve them?

VALUE: \$2,000 one-time scholarship

JOINT EFFORT PHYSICAL THERAPY SCHOLARSHIP

This scholarship, sponsored by Joint Effort Physical Therapy, supports students who have a passion for healthcare and helping people overcome physical injuries or challenges.

REQUIREMENTS:

- Minimum GPA 2.5
- Intended major in physical therapy or a related field (including, but not limited to occupational therapy, speech therapy, chiropractics, psychology, social work, message therapy, athletic training, etc.)
- Essays:

- How do you intend to impact the healthcare field?
- Are there any changes or improvements within the healthcare system that you would like to see made?

VALUE: \$1,000 per year for up to four years

KARL M. JOHNSON FOUNDATION SCHOLARSHIP

The Karl M. Johnson Foundation provides scholarships to students on the basis of community service and leadership.

REQUIREMENTS:

- Describe how you have supported your community, through volunteerism, work experience and/or other activities.

VALUE: \$2,000 one-time scholarship

KIWANIS CLUB of JACKSON HOLE JIM KAYE MEMORIAL SCHOLARSHIP

Awarded to students who exemplify community service and leadership, the Jim Kaye Memorial Scholarship is sponsored by the Kiwanis Club of Jackson Hole. Preference is given to students who have a history of community service and volunteerism. This scholarship does not allow for deferments due to gap years or missions.

REQUIREMENTS:

- Minimum GPA 2.0
- Must be a current member of the Key Club at Jackson Hole High School
- Essays:
 - What is your greatest achievement? What has been the biggest challenge of your life, and how have you overcome it?
 - What are your educational and life goals, and how will this scholarship help you achieve them?
 - Describe how you have supported your community, through volunteerism, work experience and/or other activities.

VALUE: \$1,500 over two years

LATINA LEADERSHIP SCHOLARSHIP

This scholarship celebrates the public service and community leadership of young women in Jackson Hole’s Latinx community.

REQUIREMENTS:

- Must have participated in TCSD#1's Latina Leadership program for a minimum of three years
- Must have completed at least 30 hours of community service in the last 3 years
- Essay: Describe how you have supported your community, through volunteerism, work experience and/or other activities.

VALUE: \$1,000 one-time scholarship

LEVI DOWELL MEMORIAL SCHOLARSHIP

This memorial scholarship is given in memory of Jackson Hole High School graduate Levi Dowell. It is awarded to a graduating senior based upon nomination from a teacher or counselor. Preference is given to students who demonstrate the ability to inspire others through subliminal humor, an independent drive, sense of adventure, compassion for others, and a positively skewed contrarian ambiance. The successful candidate will likely have shown great strength in the face of adversity. Financial need and lack of a clear support system are significant considerations.

REQUIREMENTS:

- Nominated by teacher or counselor
- Minimum GPA 2.5

VALUE: Up to \$500 one-time scholarship

LYMAN FOUNDATION SCHOLARSHIP

Sponsored by the Dr. Dennis and Diane Kay Robards Lyman Foundation, this scholarship supports students with financial need.

VALUE: \$2,500 one-time scholarship

MARIANA BATSON AUGÉ MEMORIAL SCHOLARSHIP

Created in memory of life-long learner and teacher, Mariana Batson Augé celebrates students who share Mariana's love of education.

REQUIREMENTS:

- Intended major in education or teaching
- Essays:

- What is your greatest achievement? What has been the biggest challenge of your life, and how have you overcome it?
- Describe your interest in teaching and education. How have you made it part of your life, and how will you continue to pursue it?

VALUE: \$1,000 one-time scholarship

MAYSIE REACH MEMORIAL SCHOLARSHIP

This award is given by the Jackson Hole Chamber of Commerce in memory of Jackson Hole High School graduate Maysie Reach. Financial need is a consideration.

REQUIREMENTS:

- Intended business administration major
- Attend a Wyoming university, college or technical school
- Two letters of recommendation
- Essays:
 - What is your greatest achievement? What has been the biggest challenge of your life, and how have you overcome it?
 - What are your educational and life goals, and how will this scholarship help you achieve them?

VALUE: Up to \$1,000. Multiple scholarships may be awarded.

MYLES BORSHELL / ART ASSOCIATION ART SCHOLARSHIP

Myles Borshell was an accomplished local artist whose monochromatic paintings have been collected throughout the country. This scholarship, created by his family in partnership with the Art Association of Jackson Hole, celebrates Myles, his art, and his vision. It is awarded to a graduating senior who has chosen to continue instruction in the visual arts or crafts. An interview and portfolio review may be required.

REQUIREMENTS:

- List of art classes you plan to take in college, with a brief description of each.

VALUE: \$1,000 one-time scholarship

ART LEADERSHIP SCHOLARSHIP IN HONOR OF THE MEMORY OF DICK JENNINGS

The National Museum of Wildlife Art sponsors this award, which celebrates a student whose passion for fine art and design has motivated them to improve their skills and share their talents with others. The student should be planning to continue their study of art and design at the college level.

REQUIREMENTS:

- Five digital images of your original artwork

VALUE: \$4,000 one-time scholarship

NELSON ENGINEERING SCHOLARSHIP

Sponsored by local consulting firm Nelson Engineering, this scholarship goes to a student enrolling in a 2 or 4-year accredited college and pursuing an undergraduate in engineering. Selection will be based on financial need, academic potential, and career goals including background and interest in mathematics, sciences and engineering. Special consideration will be given to individuals entering the civil engineering or surveying fields. The individual awarded this scholarship must use it in the academic year immediately following high school graduation.

REQUIREMENTS:

- Minimum GPA 3.0
- Intended major in engineering

This scholarship, sponsored by the local Lodge of the International Order of Oddfellows, celebrates students who exemplify the Oddfellows' commitment to community service and personal growth. The award is based mainly on financial need.

REQUIREMENTS:

- One letter of recommendation

VALUE: Varies, one-time scholarship

PATRICIA BODA MEMORIAL SCHOLARSHIP

Sponsored by the St. Johns Foundation, this scholarship celebrates the memory of Patricia Boda, who was a passionate advocate for nurses and nursing. This scholarship is intended to assist a student in their endeavors to make a difference in the lives of others through a career in the health sciences.

REQUIREMENTS:

- Intended major in nursing or a related field
- Essay: Describe the aspects of nursing that most interest you, what led you to choose the nursing profession, and how you will make a difference in patients' lives.

VALUE: \$1,000 one-time scholarship

PEER ADVOCATE SCHOLARSHIP

Community Safety Network's Peer Advocate Scholarship supports lasting change in the lives of those affected by domestic violence, sexual assault or stalking. Preference is given to students who have contributed to violence prevention, promoted healthy relationships among their peers, or who have committed to a career in violence prevention, social justice, or a related field.

REQUIREMENTS:

- Must have completed Community Safety Network’s Junior Advocate training program
- Essays:
 - Describe your interest in social justice. How have you made it part of your life, and how will you continue to pursue it?
 - Describe your interest and experience in the prevention of gender-based violence, sexual assault, and stalking, and particularly the prevention of teen dating violence.

VALUE: \$1,000 one-time scholarship

ROTARY CLUB OF JACKSON HOLE SCHOLARSHIPS

The Rotary Club of Jackson Hole Foundation is proud to provide scholarships that support graduating seniors in pursuit of their postsecondary education. Sponsored by the Jackson Women’s Soroptimist Club of Jackson Hole, this scholarship supports educational opportunities for female students who value community service. Preference will be given to applicants who show financial need.

REQUIREMENTS:

- Two letters of recommendation, one of which must be from a high school teacher or principal

VALUE: \$1,000 one-time scholarship

Sponsored by the Teton County and awarded through the Teton County Board of Commissioners, this scholarship celebrates local students and is awarded to three seniors who live in Teton County, Wyoming.

REQUIREMENTS:

- Residence in Teton County, Wyoming
- Must attend University of Wyoming, an accredited community college or accredited technical institute located in Wyoming

VALUE: \$1,000 per year for up to four years (students must maintain a GPA of 2.5 and must be enrolled full-time)

TETON COUNTY EDUCATION ASSOCIATION SCHOLARSHIP

Sponsored by the Teton County Education Association, this scholarship honors students who are planning a career in public service. Preference will be given to children of Wyoming Education Association members, children of educators, and children of Teton County School District employees.

VALUE: \$500 one-time scholarship

TETON COUNTY FAIR BOARD SCHOLARSHIP

Sponsored by the Teton County Fair Board, this scholarship honors students who have participated in the annual Teton County Fair. An interview may be

required. This scholarship does not allow for deferments due to gap years or missions.

REQUIREMENTS:

- Participated in the Teton County Fair within the past three years
- Essay on one of the following subjects:

VALUE: \$1,000 over two years

TETON COUNTY SOCIAL SERVICES SCHOLARSHIP

This scholarship, which is jointly sponsored by the Curran Seeley Foundation, Jackson Hole Community Counseling Center, and Teton Youth and Family Services, celebrates students who are committed to human services. Preference will be given to those holding a GPA of 3.0 or higher. Community involvement and job experience will also be considered. This scholarship does not allow for deferments due to gap years or missions.

REQUIREMENTS:

- Minimum GPA 2.0
- Intended major in social work, psychology, or a related field (including but not limited to behavioral health, mental health, or substance abuse)
- Essay: Describe what area of human services appeals to you and why, and how you plan to use your degree. The essay should also address the experiences or skills you have that would help you be successful in a human services field.

VALUE: \$2,500 one-time scholarship

TETON PINES COUNTRY CLUB SCHOLARSHIP

This scholarship is designed to advance the academic success of local students who have been closely involved with Teton Pines Country Club.

REQUIREMENTS:

- Employment at Teton Pines Country Club for at least one summer, caddy for a minimum of 22 rounds in any golf season, or the child of a full-time employee at Teton Pines Country Club. VALUE: \$4,000 per year for up to four years if a 2.0 GPA is maintained

Y2 CONSULTANTS STEM SCHOLARSHIP

Y2 Consultants, an engineering firm in Jackson, sponsors this scholarship, which honors women pursuing a career in engineering of natural resources. Strong preference will be shown to applicants with extracurricular activities and a history of community service.

REQUIREMENTS:

- Must identify as female
- Intended major in the field of engineering, natural resources management, or environment science
- Two letters of recommendation
- Essays:
 - Describe your interest in engineering or natural resources. How have you made it part of your life, and how will you continue to pursue it?
 - Describe how you have supported your community, through volunteerism, work experience and/or other activities.

VALUE: \$500 one-time scholarship
